ABOUT LCBC

The Lake Chad Basin Commission (LCBC) is an Inter-State Organization which was established on the 22nd of May 1964 by the four Lake Chad riparian countries, namely Cameroon, Chad, Niger, and Nigeria. The Central African Republic (CAR) and Libya have joined the Commission in 1996 and 2008 respectively, with the aim of promoting cooperation and management of water and other environmental resources in the Lake Chad Basin. Its mandate includes (i) the sustainable and equitable management of the waters of Lake Chad and other transboundary water resources in the Lake Chad Basin; (ii) the conservation of the ecosystems of the Conventional Basin; (iii) the promotion of regional integration, the preservation of peace and security in the Conventional Basin. This is particularly only possible through the implementation of projects aimed at improving access to drinking water, strengthening the resilience of populations to climate change and consolidating peace and security in the region. In recent decades, however, the LCBC has been facing complex multidimensional challenges such as environmental degradation, poverty, insecurity, drastic reduction in the surface area of the lake, due to droughts, undue exploitation of resources and climate deterioration, etc.

The main duties and responsibilities of the Rural Development Expert include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Support the Technical Department in implementing the Strategic Action Programme (SAP) and the Regional Stabilization Strategy (RSS) for the Lake Chad Basin;
- Conduct assessments works to understand specific needs, challenges, and opportunities within rural communities in the Lake Chad Basin;
- Identify and design projects aimed at improving basic social infrastructures and economic opportunities in rural communities in the Lake Chad Basin;
- Propose and design plan for engagement with local communities to ensure their participation and inputs in development projects fostering a sense of ownership and sustainability;
- Propose and design capacity building for NGOs and local communities to enhance their skills and capabilities in managing and sustaining development projects;
- Identify and make recommendations for resources mobilization from various sources to support rural development initiatives;
- Contribute to the identification of methods and practices needed to transform rural areas into agricultural productive areas, thereby improving the health and nutritional status of rural communities in the basin;
- Prepare technical notes on the dissemination of identified methods and practices and support capacity building of stakeholders to ensure the implementation of these notes;
- Lead the preparation (together with Socio-Economist, Fishery and Aquaculture, and Agro-Pastoralism Experts) of the annual report on food security in the basin and make relevant recommendations for decision-making;
- Collaborate with other experts to formulate and/or propose policy changes/harmonizations to ensure integrated rural development in the Lake Chad Basin with a focus on the institutional aspect of Member States;
- Contribute to the elaboration of Annual Monitoring Report (AMR) for the Lake Chad Basin.
- Perform any other duties assigned to him or her by the LCBC.
