ABOUT LCBC

The Lake Chad Basin Commission (LCBC) is an Inter-State Organization which was established on the 22nd of May 1964 by the four Lake Chad riparian countries, namely Cameroon, Chad, Niger, and Nigeria. The Central African Republic (CAR) and Libya have joined the Commission in 1996 and 2008 respectively, with the aim of promoting cooperation and management of water and other environmental resources in the Lake Chad Basin. Its mandate includes (i) the sustainable and equitable management of the waters of Lake Chad and other transboundary water resources in the Lake Chad Basin; (ii) the conservation of the ecosystems of the Conventional Basin; (iii) the promotion of regional integration, the preservation of peace and security in the Conventional Basin. This is particularly through the implementation of projects and programs aimed at improving access to drinking water, strengthening the resilience of populations to climate change and consolidating peace and security in the region. In recent decades, however, the LCBC has been facing complex multidimensional challenges such as environmental degradation, poverty, insecurity, drastic reduction in the surface area of the lake, due to droughts, undue exploitation of resources and climate deterioration, etc.

THE FUNCTION

Under the direct supervision of the Head of Division of Cooperation and Project, the Monitoring and Evaluation Expert is mainly responsible for ensuring that projects and programs are effective, efficient, and achieving their intended outcomes, providing valuable insights for decision-making and strategic planning

THE ROLE

Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Expert plays a crucial role in assessing the performance and impact of projects, programs, and policies/Strategies implementation in the Commission.

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KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

The main duties and responsibilities of this position include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Developing and/or implimenting frameworks and systems to monitor and evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of projects and programs. This involves defining indicators, setting targets, and establishing data collection methods;
- Design and ensure the implementation of results-based monitoring and evaluation system for projects and programs;
- Examine monitoring reports, analyze them and identify the causes of any bottlenecks in project and program implementation and propose possible solutions;
- Ensuring that M&E practices comply with relevant standards, guidelines, and regulations, and aligning with the Commission or donor requirements;
- Engaging with stakeholders, including beneficiaries, project staff, and donors, to gather feedback and ensure that M&E activities are responsive to their needs and expectations;
- Monitoring ongoing project activities to ensure they are on track and making necessary adjustments to address any issues or challenges;
- Learning and Improvement: Using evaluation findings to promote organizational learning and continuous improvement, helping to refine strategies and approaches for better outcomes;
- Providing actionable recommendations based on evaluation findings to improve project design, implementation, and impact.
- Consolidate activity reports on the basis of the reports provided by each Division/Department/Projects/Programs to draft the annual activity report on the basis of the data provided;
- Contribute to the elaboration of the Commission Annual Work Plan and Budget
- Contribute to the preparation of the Lake Chad Basin Annual Monitoring Report (AMR);
- Execute any other function assign to you by the Commission.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Master's degree in Public Administration, International Development, Social Sciences, Statistics, Development Studies, Project Management or any other relevant domain;
- Have at least ten (10) years of professional experience in monitoring and evaluation, including hands-on experience with data collection, analysis, and reporting. Experience in similar fields like research or project management can also be valuable.;
- Proficiency in data analysis tools and software (e.g., SPSS, R, or Excel) is crucial for analysing quantitative and qualitative data;
